Calling all Gillivervet clients, if you haven't already done so, please get your complimentary, promotional headcollar from the practice when you collect your horse after treatment. With a choice of sizes, they are a stylish addition to your horse's wardrobe.

Microchipping



Just to remind everyone that all foals registered after 1st July 2009 must be microchipped according to new legislation.



The microchips are implanted in your horse's neck by means of a simple, painless injection. The microchip carries a unique number which is read by an electric scanner. This number is registered on a national database together with your details as the horse's owner. If your horse is found following theft or loss, you will have an indisputable way of providing that you are the rightful owner. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any queries.

Vaccinations



This is just a polite reminder that remembering your horse's vaccination dates is the responsibility of the horse owner. Please don't rely on receiving the reminder cards that we send as for one reason and another it may not arrive with you. On the reverse of the newsletter please detach the slip and keep it safe to remind you when your horse's injections are due.

BREED FEATURE

SHETLAND PONY



A registered Shetland pony must not exceed 42 inches at 4 yrs or over. They can be any colour other than spotted.

A Shetland pony should have a small and in proportion head with small, erect, wide set ears that point forward. Their feet should be tough, round and well shaped to compliment a straight, free action.



Today the Shetland pony no longer has the hardworking life of its ancestors, as nowadays the main employment is for a child's riding pony or for carriage driving, and it is hugely popular world-wide.

A most salient and essential feature of the Shetland pony is its general air of vitality (presence), stamina and robustness.

Your Equine First Aid Kit



A well equipped and correctly stocked first aid kit is essential for any horse owner/yard to have in an emergency, whether you are an avid competitor or just own a horse for pleasure/ hacking etc. Below is a list of the basic essentials required in a good first aid kit. Having these items easily accessible, would ensure all minor injuries could be dealt with and more serious injuries could be attended to until the vet arrives. Obviously if you are ever unsure of the significance of an injury, please call us immediately.

What a First Aid Kit should contain:

- Sterile dressings of various sizes (e.g Melolin, allevyn)
- Large roll of cotton wool
- Open weave bandage
 - Vet wrap
 - Elastoplast
- Intrasite Gel
- Hibiscrub
 - Salt
- Thermometer
- Animalintex
- Round ended Curved Scissors
- Your details: name, number, vets name, yard name etc.

Vaccination Protocol

Apart from your horse's health and well being, this protocol must be followed if you wish to enter competitions.

Influenza/Tetanus

1st vaccination

2nd vaccination 21-92 days after 1st

3rd vaccination 150-215 days after 2nd (5-7 months)

Booster annually, within 1 year of previous vaccination (no more than 365 days)
