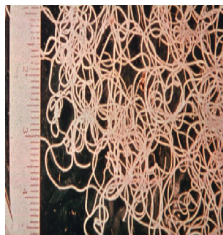

Arab

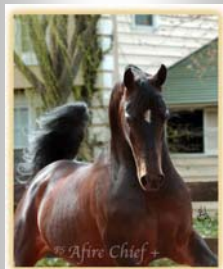
The Arab horse society was founded in 1918 and is a registered charity, promoting the breeding and importation of pure bred Arabian Horse, encouraging the wider use of Arab blood in light horse and riding pony breeding.

The Arabian/Arab horse originated in Arabian Peninsula. With a distinctive head shape and high tail carriage, the Arabian is one of the most recognizable breed in the world.



Distinguishing features:

- Finely chiselled bone structure
- Concave profile
- Arched neck
- High tail carriage



Today Arab blood lines are found in almost every modern breed of riding horse. The Arab is a versatile breed, dominating the discipline of endurance riding and compete in many other fields of equestrian activity.

SOME HANDY HINTS

- If you take your horse in a school or out in the field, putting lard, Vaseline or something like this in hooves will help prevent snow becoming clogged.
- Always ensure you have grit stocked up to create safe pathways.
- If you are unable to get your horse out of the stable, it is a good idea to cut out hard feed to keep horses sane and sensible.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO GET YOUR BOOSTERS DONE IN TIME!!



The horrendous weather over the last few weeks has highlighted the importance for horse owners to organise annual vaccinations and boosters in plenty of time. This will ensure that if for any reason your vet is unable to come out (i.e. the weather) on your final vaccination day, your horse will be fully guarded and legal for competition.



PAYING BY CHEQUE

Over the past few months, we have received several cheques on their own in an envelope with no name/account etc, which makes it very difficult to identify who has sent it. If you are sending a cheque to pay your bill please ensure you **write your name and the account** that you are paying, to assist us with allocating payment to your account. Thank you

PASSPORTS!!!!!!!

Please ensure that you always have your horses passport with you when travelling anywhere. Without a valid Equine Passport it is illegal to transport or sell your horse to a new keeper. There is a hefty fine for non compliance if caught transporting horses without a valid Passport. Please ensure that the medicinal treatment section of the passport is completed if you wish to exclude your horse/pony from the food chain. It is also extremely important to ensure you bring your passport with you if you are bringing your horse to Gillivervet. For more information visit: www.horsepassportagency.co.uk



Stud Work at Gillivervet



Spring is just around the corner and mare owners may be thinking about the forthcoming stud season. Whether you are thinking of natural covering or artificial insemination we can help. Gillivervet is a British Equine Veterinary Association approved centre for Artificial Insemination using fresh, chilled or frozen semen. We have "Stud Packages" in place which are optional schemes where the mare owner pays in advance a "one off" fee to cover routine scanning, drugs and fertility treatment for up to 3 breeding cycles. These schemes can be used whether the mare is visiting one of our stud owner clients or here at Garwood.

As mares are required to have had a clitoral swab and blood tests done before going to stud it is necessary to get the wheels in motion in plenty of time. At Garwood we are able to provide excellent stabling for mares with or without a foal at foot.

If anyone is interested in putting their mare/mares in foal this year please ring the practice and we can explain the different procedures and packages we have to offer.
